



"Falconcity of Wonders" firms up UD alumni-student ties



University of Dubai (UD) organized the 3rd Annual Meeting of its alumni held at Shangri-La Hotel in Dubai, under the sponsorship of "Falconcity of Wonders" project developed by Salem Ahmad Almoosa Enterprises, one of the biggest construction projects in the UAE and is a symbol of the UAE's heritage. The event was an educational and community-oriented occasion where the university management participated along with the sponsor. It

was attended by nearly 300 alumni of various nationalities.

The Internship and Career Development Center (ICDC) also took the opportunity to launch a new and innovative program called "Alumni Guidance to Students."
